

FADE IN FROM BLACK as we hear 1:02-1:08 of "Wawa Hoagies" (Aaron Out, 2017). Lyrics: "Seen this bad chick, standing up in the line / She was fine, so I hopped in and I crept up from behind."

Nighttime. Extreme close-up on the faces of Saul and Grace, who lay next to each other on their backs.

GRACE

I had a great time tonight.

SAUL

You were amazing. Fearless. Your stamina was incredible. I can't believe that was your first time.

They recognize that they're playing the Innuendo Game, and they lean into it. The camera gradually pulls back to let us in on the joke, too: it reveals that they're on a RED-WHITE-AND-BLUE BLANKET, wearing shirts, with matching "Clean The Darn Air" political stickers.

GRACE

My parents could've shown up! And my body... my body was covered in sweat.

SAUL

It was *hot*. You know, I could hear you. I loved every sound you made.

GRACE

Thought my *voice* was gonna give out!

SAUL

I thought my *back* was gonna give out...

They sit up. They're on the grass, not far from a BIKE and a Lime SCOOTER. Saul has a backpack. Near each of them is a signboard ("Utah Voters: Sign Here to Clean The Darn Air") and a signature packet.

GRACE

(briefly interrupting,
giving Saul her packet)
Seventy-five signatures.

SAUL

...and if you think *that* was great, wait 'til we do it in *Provo*... at the farmers market!

We see title cards with information about the movie, maybe a call for investors. We hear 1:15-1:21 of "Wawa Hoagies" (Aaron Out, 2017). Lyrics: "Shortie had a Shorti and a pack of Black and Milds / Cracked a smile, then she told me I was really acting wild."

They separate, Saul moving toward the bike, Grace toward the Lime scooter.

GRACE

Text me about next time. You're not gonna ghost me, are you?

Saul speaks to Grace, then half to Grace, then (quietly) to himself.

SAUL

Not after tonight! Not a chance.
Seventy-five signatures....

Maybe we see more information about the movie, maybe just the title and contact info and the tag line "Some men are only after one thing." We hear 1:21-1:27 or more of "Wawa Hoagies" (Aaron Out, 2017). Lyrics: "I told her we should blaze up, she could get to know me / But first—hold up!—I'm waiting on my hoagie. [Chorus at 1:28: "We eatin' Wawa hoagies..."] FADE TO BLACK. CREDITS.
